

ALLOWABLE MAIL ITEMS DENVER SHERIFF DEPARTMENT

Addressing Mail:

Inmate's name **and CD#**
P.O. Box 1108
Denver, CO 80201

The inmate CD number is necessary in order to avoid mail mix up among inmates with similar names.

Stationery mailed from an individual:

- Legal mail
- Personal letters
- 25 white envelopes, 25 stamps, 2 white or yellow legal pads (this amount can be received every 30 days only)**
- Photos (no larger than 5x7 and no sexually explicit or nude photos, no gang related photos and no poster size cards).
Not to exceed 10 within a 6 month period
- One (1) religious Bible, Koran and or five (5) pamphlets
- Colored pencils (must be no longer than 3 inches in length and no more than 12 pencils)

Stationery mailed directly from Stationery Store (i.e. Office Depot, Office Max, etc) (Once every 30 days)**

- 12 legal pads
- 100 envelopes
- 100 stamps

****PLEASE NOTE:** IF INMATE RECEIVES MORE THAN THE STATED AMOUNT OF ITEMS ABOVE IN A 30 DAY PERIOD, THOSE ADDITIONAL ITEMS WILL BE RETURNED TO SENDER.

Cashiers Checks and Money Orders:

Cashiers Checks, money orders, payroll checks ARE accepted. PLEASE NOTE: Non-postal money orders and payroll checks are subject to a 14 day hold.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED IN MAIL:

- Ink pens
- Spiral notebooks
- Personal stationary
- Laminated or plastic cards (i.e. religious cards, etc)
- Stickers, tape, paste or any item with a glued surface
- Correspondence with questionable substances or stains (which appear on the correspondence)

BOOKS:

All books must be shipped directly from a book store (receipt required)
No more than five (5) books at one time, this includes magazines.

MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTABLE:

- Material is unacceptable for regular mailing with the U.S. Postal Service
- Materials that appeal to a morbid interest (i.e. nudity, sex, sadism, masochism)
- Materials that defame, vilify or incite hatred toward different races, religions, creeds or national origins.
- Materials advocating the violent overthrow of the existing forms of government or portraying such conduct as commendable.
- Materials depicting the use or manufacture of firearms, explosives or other weapons
- Materials depicting or relating to locksmithing, lock picking or ways to defeat security or locking mechanisms or systems.
